About Vancouver Peace Poppies



Vancouver Peace Poppies was started in 2008 by Teresa Gagné and Denis Laplante. We are an unregistered non-profit whose goal is consciousness raising, not fundraising.

We want to encourage Canadians to broaden their Remembrance Day focus to include the civilians who now make up 90% of conflict victims; to challenge the beliefs, values and institutions that make war seem inevitable; and to urge our government to promote and fund effective non-military means of dispute resolution, both at home and abroad.

To further this goal **Vancouver Peace Poppies** undertakes three main activities:

- Importing white lapel poppies from the Peace Pledge Union in Britain, (where the white poppy started in 1933) and making them available through depots in Vancouver, and across Canada by mail-order.
- A Schools campaign, which provides public schools in BC and other parts of Canada with subsidized white lapel poppies, and related peace-focussed classroom resources for both elementary and secondary school students.
- An annual Remembrance Day ceremony Let Peace be Their Memorial, in which handmade wreaths are laid to commemorate overlooked victims of war.
